Dining at the restaurant is not available during the lockdown period. Takeout (food, wine, mixed drinks) and meals at home menus are available at chezgillesmeaford.ca

- All employees and suppliers undergo health screening before entering the restaurant. If they present signs of illness they will not enter the building.

- Masks are worn by employees within the restaurant and all employees follow strict hygiene routines at all times (hand washing or sanitizing after serving and clearing, before preparing drinks etc.)
- Only designated staff have access to the kitchen pass and are permitted to deliver food to guests.
- Hand sanitizer is provided to all guests upon arrival and all guests visiting our restaurant will be required to use hand sanitizer prior to entering.
- All surfaces within the takeout collection area of the restaurant are sanitized thoroughly at frequent intervals
- Guests can view our entire menu online at chezgillesmeaford.ca
- All guests are asked to maintain physical distancing (2 metres apart) when collecting from the restaurant, and wear face masks at all times
- Set pickup slots every 15 minutes
- Maximum of 2 guests in the restaurant at a time
- Payment processing pin pads are sanitized before and after each use.

Covid Screening Questions

1. Do you have any of the following new or worsening symptoms or signs? Symptoms should not be chronic or related to other known causes or conditions.

Fever or chills, Difficulty breathing or shortness of breath, Cough, Sore throat, trouble swallowing, Runny nose/stuffy nose or nasal congestion, Decrease or loss of smell or taste, Nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, Not feeling well, extreme tiredness, sore muscles

2. Have you travelled outside of Canada in the past 14 days?

3. Have you had close contact with a confirmed or probable case of COVID-19?

If the individual answers **NO** to all questions from 1 through 3, they have passed and can enter the workplace.
